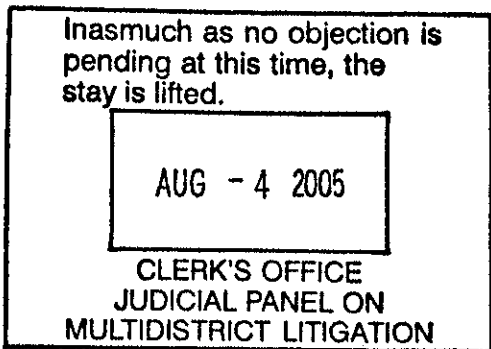
**CONDITIONAL TRANSFER ORDER (CTO-4)**
