It is hereby ORDERED that, effective April 1, 2003, an official court reporter is entitled to transcript fees at the following rates:

Expedited Transcript	\$4.40	\$.83	\$.55
Daily Transcript	\$5.50	\$1.10	\$.83
Hourly Transcript	\$6.60	\$1.10	\$.83
Realtime Transcript	\$2.75	\$1.10	

Definitions.

1. Ordinary Transcript: A transcript to be delivered within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of an order.
2. Expedited Transcript: A transcript to be delivered within seven (7) calendar days after receipt of an order.
3. Daily Transcript: A transcript to be delivered following adjournment and prior to the normal opening hour of the court on the following morning whether or not it actually is a court day.
4. Hourly Transcript: A transcript of proceedings ordered under unusual circumstances to be delivered within two (2) hours.
5. Realtime Transcript: A draft unedited transcript produced by a certified realtime reporter as a byproduct of realtime to be delivered electronically during proceedings or immediately following adjournment.
