WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the United States District Court for the District of Connecticut entered a General Order regarding the Restriction on Visitors to Courthouses (the "District Court General Order"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, the District Court General Order applies to the United States Courthouses in the Brien McMahon Federal Building in Bridgeport, Connecticut, the Abraham Ribicoff Federal Building in Hartford, Connecticut, and the Richard C. Lee U.S. Courthouse in New Haven, Connecticut;

AND


WHEREAS, the New Haven Division of the United States Bankruptcy Court conducts its operations in the Connecticut Financial Center located at 157 Church Street, New Haven, Connecticut;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, effective immediately, the provisions of the District Court General Order apply to all matters pending in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of Connecticut at all of its locations, including the New Haven Division of the United States Bankruptcy Court located at 157 Church Street, New Haven, Connecticut.

IN RE: Restriction on Visitors to Courthouses

GENERAL ORDER

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Connecticut has declared a public health emergency throughout the State;

AND

WHEREAS, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention having advised people to take precautions due to the COVID-19 virus (coronavirus) outbreak, and having noted that the best way to prevent illness is to avoid being exposed to the virus, through, among other means, social distancing;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, effective immediately, that the following persons shall not enter any courthouse in the District of Connecticut:

- Persons who have been in any of the following locations within the last 14 days:

CHINA  
SOUTH KOREA  
JAPAN  
ITALY  
IRAN  
NEW ROCHELLE, NEW YORK (other than in a car or train)  
ANY LOCALE THAT IS IN QUARANTINE

(This list may be updated as further guidance is received.)

- Persons who reside or have had close contact with someone who has been in one of the locations listed above within the last 14 days;
- Persons who have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, hospital, health provider, or public health official;
- Persons who have been diagnosed with, or have had contact with, anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

**Anyone attempting to enter in violation of these protocols will be denied entry by a Court Security Officer.**

If you have a scheduled appointment or you are otherwise required to appear at one of the courthouses in the District of Connecticut, and you are unable to appear because of the restrictions listed above, you should proceed as follows:

- If you are represented by an attorney, please contact your attorney;
- If you are an attorney and you are scheduled to appear in court before a judge, please contact that judge's chambers directly (contact information may be found on the Court's website);
- If you are scheduled to meet with a Probation officer, please contact the Probation Office at the relevant location and phone number below:
