(Parking in emergency vehicle spaces, areas, and lanes bordered in red or posted as EMERGENCY VEHICLES ONLY or FIRE LANE, or parking within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.)

Reckless or Unsafe Operations

(Operation of a vehicle in a reckless or unsafe manner.)

Explosives (41 CFR 102-74.435)

No person entering or while on property may carry or possess explosives, or items intended to be used to fabricate an explosive or incendiary device, either openly or concealed, except for official purposes.

Weapons (41 CFR 102-74.440)

Federal law prohibits the possession of firearms or other dangerous weapons in Federal facilities and Federal court facilities by all persons not specifically authorized by *Title 18, United States Code, Section 930.*

Violators will be subject to fine and/or imprisonment for periods up to five (5) years.
