GENERAL ORDER

WHEREAS, the Court continues to monitor scientific guidance regarding COVID-19 and other respiratory viruses;

WHEREAS, recent guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicates that due to the prevalence of vaccines and other interventions, restrictions on activities imposed during the height of the pandemic are no longer necessary;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, effective immediately and until further order of the Court, that:

- 1) This order supersedes the General Order entered on March 2, 2023.
- 2) Persons experiencing symptoms of respiratory viruses, such as fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, extreme fatigue, nausea or vomiting, congestion or runny nose, muscle or body aches, headache, sore throat, diarrhea, or the new loss of the sense of taste or smell, should stay home and away from others; but such persons may enter the courthouse when symptoms are improving overall and, if a fever was present, it has been gone for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication.
